Miss Carrie H. Rose, having returned from furlough, has been associated with Miss Smith in the work at Sapporo.

Girls School, Sapporo.--Miss Smith has bravely held the fort alone at this station in the Hokkaido as in years past. She has now been joined, however, by Miss Carrie H. Rose, formerly of the Joshi Gakuin, who with her own consent has been transferred to Sapporo. This reinforcement has long been needed, both for companionship

and because of the pressure of the work. The school with a roll of 47 is conducted in three departments, in buildings which are furnished by the Government. Of the pupils in school, 8 are professing Christians and 5 others have expressed a wish to be baptized. There is a regularly organized church in Sapporo with a Sunday-school numbering 450. Eleven of the girls from the boarding-school are teachers in this Sunday-school.
