HOKKAIDO: Sapporo—Sapporo is the capital of the Hokkaido (Yezo), 550 miles north of Tokyo; Station occupied 1887; missionaries—Miss S. C. Smith, Miss L. A. Wells.

At Sapporo, where Miss Smith had been left alone by the removal of Mr. and Mrs. Pierson to their new home at Asahigawa, the Northern Star Academy for girls was conducted by Miss Smith and Miss Wells, who came to join her in the fall. The total number of pupils registered was over 100.

The church here never seemed in a better condition than now under the care of the gentle, spiritual and earnest pastor Mr. Shimidzu from the Meiji Gakuin.
