Hokusei Girls' School, Sapporo, in the far north, by September 11th, only 10 days after the earthquake, had sent 24 great bundles containing 2,520 large garments, 54 pieces of bedding, and a large number of smaller articles ; also a big hamper of European clothing and bedding. Later, more than 100 new garments were made and sent, besides cash gifts of 109 yen.
